- 80.4% of summer birthdays entered at age 5



### **Registration Overview**

Registration opens on February 1st and is due April 1st. There are two parts to the registration process:

Part 1: Complete & submit online forms

Part 2: Print and fill out the listed forms & collect

required documents.

**NOTE:** Current SPS Preschool Program families have an abridged registration process, which will be communicated by an email to you.

with a staff member. Your registration is not complete until we have all required items.

#### C. New Student Transportation Form

Only complete this if you plan to use the school bus for transportation.

This is not preschool or special education transportation. Transportation fees may apply.

If you have questions about transportation, please see the Transportation Website. Please do not contact the Transportation Office for bus routes or stops at this time. The routes for next year cannot be put together until full enrollment is known for next year, so this information will be posted on the Sudbury website much closer to the start of school next year.

#### **Documents to Collect:**

- 1. Copy of your child's birth certificate, adoption decree, or US passport
- Copy of most recent doctor's physical form (within the last 13 months), including a lead test, and immunization records (birth to current date)
  - These forms are generated from your child's pediatrician. If needed, you can use the form <u>linked</u> here.
- 3. Special Education Records IEP or 504 Plan (if applicable)
- 4. Proof of Residency (POR)
  - . See "Proof of Sudbury Residency Requirements" listed in the sidebar of this page.





### **Proof of Residency**



You must provide <u>three</u> documents in total. At least one document from <u>EACH</u> of the following categories:

- Evidence of Residency (1 document)
- 2. Evidence of Occupancy (1 document)
- 3. Evidence of Identification (1 document)



### **Evidence of Residency Examples**

- Lease and/or Rental Agreement for the year of school enrollment (executed by both parties)
- Mortgage payment and/or property tax bill
- Residency/Occupancy Affidavit Landlord/Shared Tenancies
- Purchase and Sale (P&S) Agreement <u>along with</u> a signed statement by a Bank Officer or licensed Real Estate Broker certifying financial commitment
- Section 8 Agreement



### **Evidence of Occupancy Examples**

Utility Bill: Fuel, Electric, Water

- SETTLE SETTLE STATE OF THE SETTLE STATE OF THE
- If a utility bill cannot be provided prior to student's enrollment:
  - Purchase & Sale (P&S) Agreement <u>AND</u>
  - Signed statement by a Bank Officer or licensed Real Estate Broker certifying financial commitment
- Residency/Occupancy Affidavit Landlord Shared Tenancies

  - Special Education Transportation is different
  - Bus passes mailed in August
  - Transportation Department will send amount due
  - Financial Aid Available
- Full Day K \$0 fee
- K Students can purchase lunch

### **Health Information**

- Immunizations
- Physical Exam
  - Lead Test
  - Vision Exam
- Medical Conditions

- 2 doses of Varicella Vaccine or physician certified history of Chickenpox disease
- 3 doses Hepatitis B Vaccine
- 5 doses DTAP/DPT Vaccine
- 4 doses Polio Vaccine
- 2 doses MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)
- Lead Screening
- Physical Exam
- Vision Screening

All documentation is required in your school health office of your child's school by **August 19, 2024** 

Students will not be allowed to attend school without this documentation





# Kindergarten METCO Program

- Our Sudbury Team is here to welcome and support you in this transition to Kindergarten. This would include our METCO staff.
- Registration paperwork will be collected through the Sudbury Public Schools
- Meet and greet dates this spring: TBD Stay tuned!
- Engage proactively with Boston and Sudbury families and community
- Equitable access to a developmentally appropriate and inclusive Kindergarten program

### **English Language Development**

- 78 languages and dialects spoken in Sudbury!
- Home Language Survey all families complete online form (paper version available in 26 languages).
- Students who mention any language other than English are flagged for English language proficiency screening
- All proficiency levels welcome!
- ELD Program: most of the day with native-English speaking peers, individual and small group instruction in English
- Translators and interpreters are available for families

- Families will be given a scheduled appointment time to visit the kindergarten classroom and meet their teachers while seeing the classroom, cubbies and more.

- Teachers will have a chance to make a connection with each student and play a game/K screening activity

A <u>brief</u> developmental screening instrument that is individually administered.

#### Timelines:

- During your child's first Welcome Day of school
- Screening team reviews each child's results and data
- More detailed 'progress data' shared at parent conferences
- Rescreen (if needed) in January
- Continuous progress monitoring



### Highly Specialized Programs in SPS

#### **ALL SCHOOLS**

#### Learning Center/Resource Rooms/Skills Classes

Serves students grades K-8, with all disabilities, in a wrap around services delivery model that includes in class and/or pull out support for students. Students are taught academic skills for content as well as organization and executive functioning.

#### **HAYNES**

#### **Partner Program**

Serves students with Autism Spectrum Disorders as well as other students who require intensive Applied Behavior Analysis programming.

#### **Steps Program**

Serves students with intellectual, neurological and/or communication disabilities with both sub-separate and small group learning in general education content area classes.

#### **NIXON**

#### **Access Program**

Serves students primarily with social emotional disabilities in grades K-8. The psychologists/school adjustment counselors provide ongoing therapeutic support and social skill instruction. BCBAs work in consult with all staff.

#### **LORING**

#### Language Achievement & Beyond (LAB) Program

Serves students grades 3-8 with language based learning disabilities. Provides specialized instruction with a systematic and multisensory methodology in either a co-taught or substantially separate structure with both individual and small group instruction.

#### **NOYES**

#### **Foundations**

Provides highly-specialized instruction and services to students primarily with autism, communication, self-regulation and social/pragmatic language needs in either an integrated or substantially separate structure.

#### **Sudbury Preschool Program**

Integrated classroom for all students with related services in Speech, Physical, and Occupational Therapy.
