Regular Session Meeting

Chair Silvia Nerssessian opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m.

- 1. Opening Statement / Regular Session
 - a. Chair Silvia Nerssessian performed a roll call and made an announcement that the session is being recorded, shared live for the public to see and hear and there should be no expected right to privacy, as this is a public forum. Meredith Gerson, Nicole Burnard, Mandy Sim, Sarah Troiano and Silvia Nerssessian all affirmed in the positive.

Public Comment:

a. Susan Berry, Sudbury resident, acknowledged she is a member of the Finance Committee but was speaking to the Committee on behalf of herself. She shared suggestions and recommendations on how to lower the override amount if one is being recommended by the Committee.

3. Business and Policy Matters

- a. Superintendent's FY24 Recommended Budget Review
 - i. Chair Nerssessian confirmed this is an opportunity for dialogue and to get clarification on any questions regarding the proposed budget.
 - ii. Superintendent Crozier shared potential areas of reduction if needing to stay within the town's recommended budget.
 - iii. If an override is considered, the average increase in taxes per household will be around \$182.83. He then shared possible considerations to

- reduce the gap which include medical reimbursement and uncommitted circuit breaker reimbursement funds.
- iv. Clarifying questions from the Committee surrounded how much of the medicaid payments have come in and were they the amounts we expected. Can funds be designated to SPS so they don't go to free cash. How many unexpected out of district placements were there.
- v. The Committee discussed the benefits of an override as it helps to fund the gap in the future vs. using circuit breaker funds which have the potential of unpredictability. They then discussed the proposed medicaid reimbursement town meeting warrant article and the concerns about the efforts in keeping up with the process to apply for these funds on a yearly basis.
- vi. Chair Silvia Nerssessian moves to approve the Superintendent recommended FY24 budget of \$43,976,000. Sarah Troiano seconded the motion.
