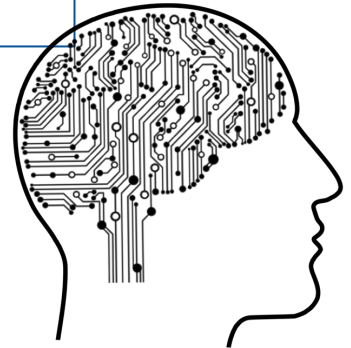

# Professional Learning

# Tuition Reimbursement

*To date, during the 2020-21 school year, 53 educators have earned 94 graduate credits.*

- Contractual benefit
- Educators are eligible for up to twelve graduate or other PDP credit hours with a maximum of \$3200 annually
- Approval is contingent upon relevance to educator's current assignment or professional goal within the field of education

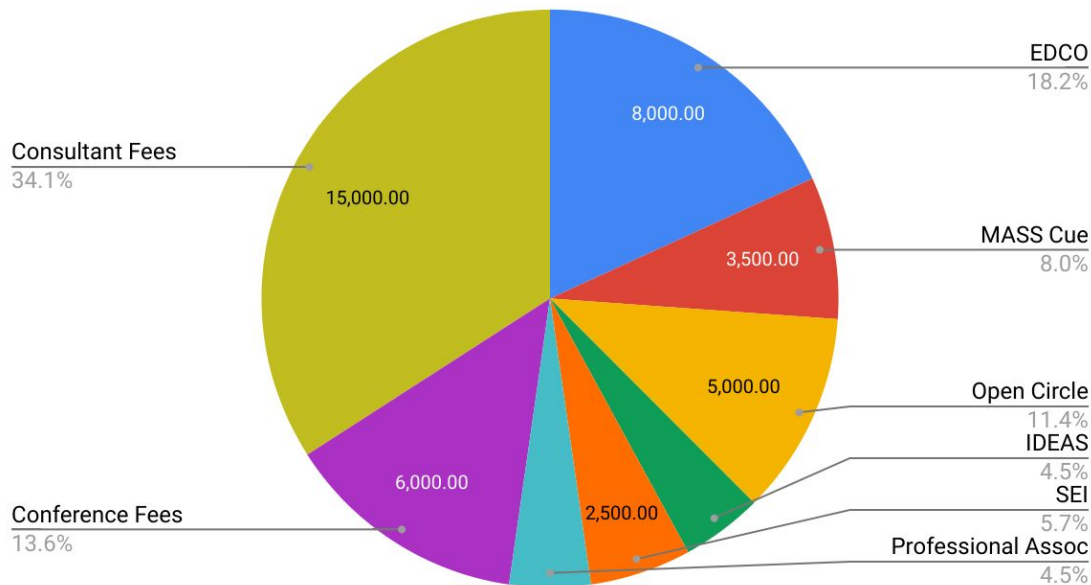

# PD Other & Professional Associations

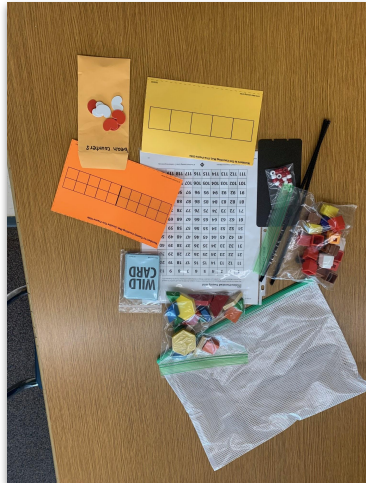
- Decrease in SEI due to % of teachers now endorsed.

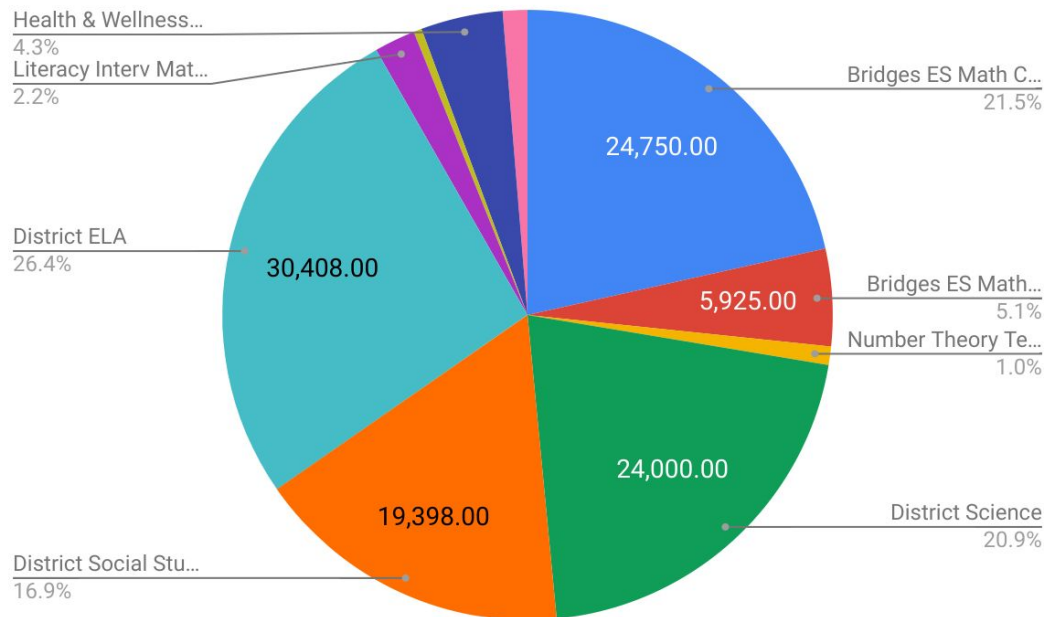

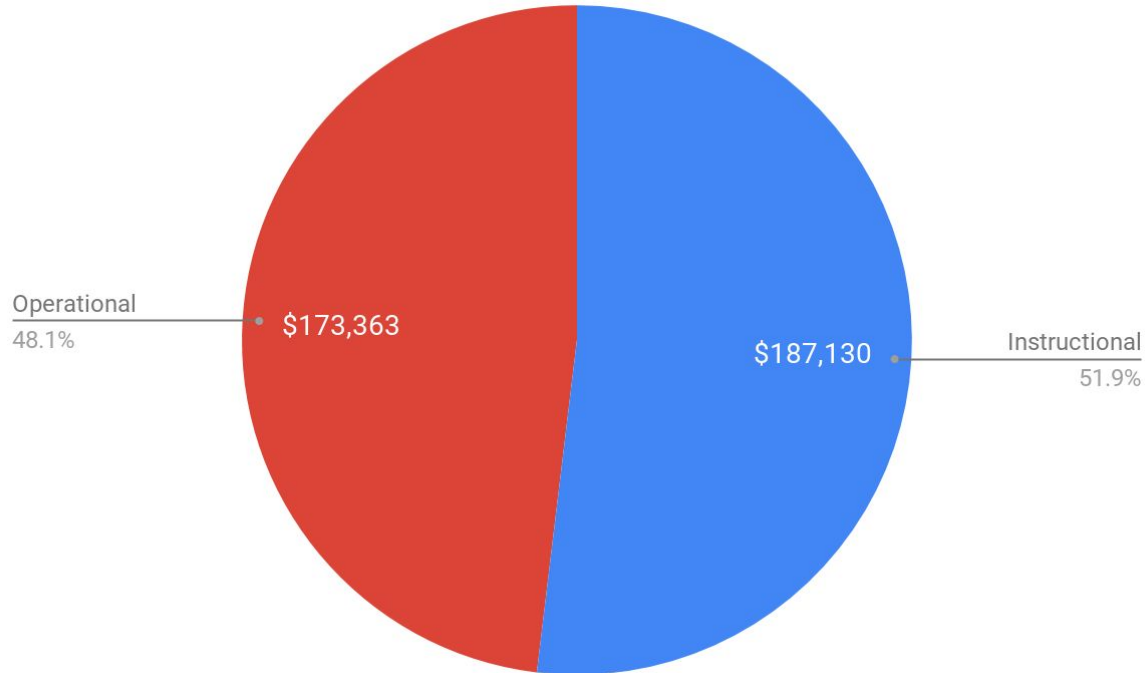
# Curriculum Supplies

- *Implement 3-8 universal screening assessment*



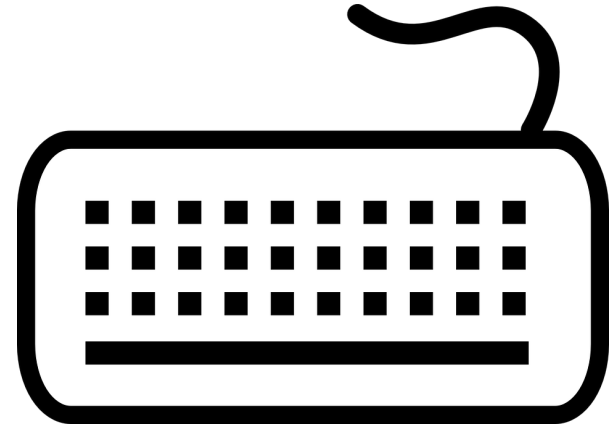

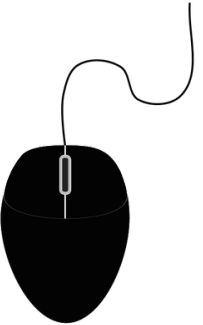

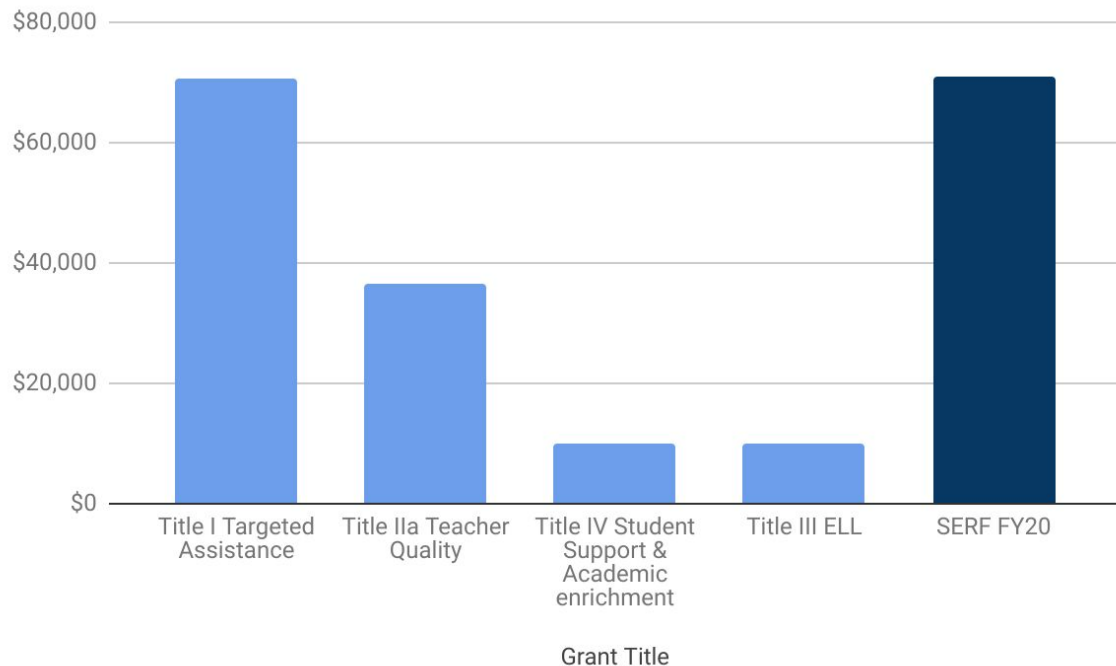
# New Equipment: \$265,000

Grant funding captures federal entitlement grants and local education foundation grants. It does not reflect one-time grants.

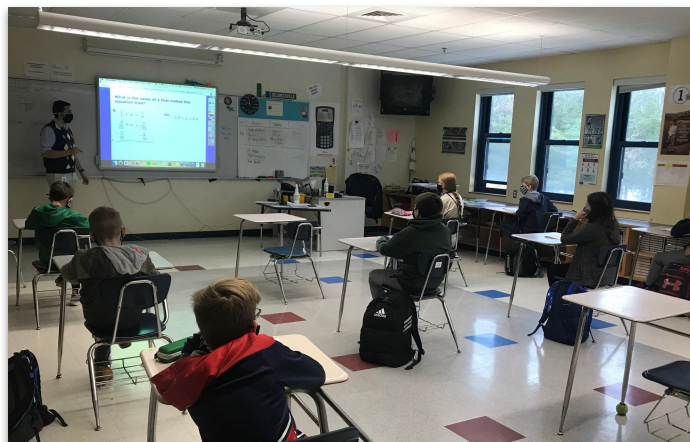
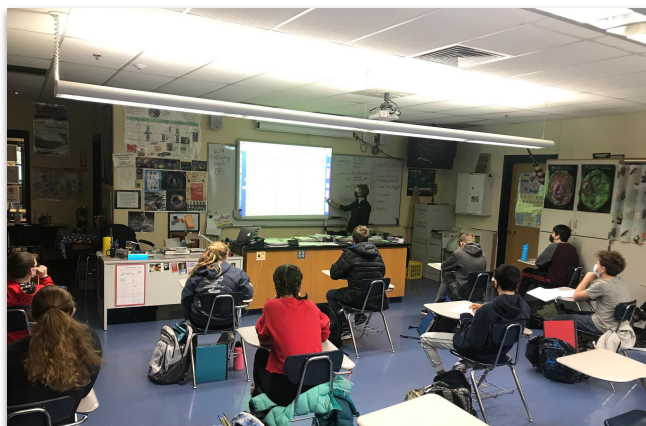
