The METCO Program

Sudbury Public Schools enrolled its first forty students from Boston on January 27, 1975. This academic school year marks the 44th year for Sudbury as a participating METCO district with <u>44</u> students enrolled in 4 elementary schools and <u>26</u> students at the middle school.

New METCO Application & Enrollment

- Boston families with school-aged children are encouraged to apply online from any device or in the METCO office.
- The application window is open from October December
- METCO Inc will assign a random referral number to each applicant
- Siblings with completed application receive priority referral
- Families not accepted can re-apply every year

SPS Enrollment Process

- Consult with the Assistant Superintendent to determine grades with available seats
- Review applications
- Invite prospective families to Sudbury for a placement meeting
- Notify parents/legal guardians of placement status for 2020-2021 academic year
- Conduct new family orientation.

New to Sudbury Public Schools

The 2019-2020 academic year marks the first time that the SPS METCO Program has welcomed kindergarten students due to a policy change made by the SPS School Committee. Six new kindergarten students have joined the SPS METCO Program and the class of 2032; four at Nixon and two at Haynes Elementary Schools.




METCO Awards-students were recognized for their commitment to academic achievement, participation in extracurricular activities, and for creating strong social connections within the Sudbury community

MCAS Bootcamp in Boston: February and April Vacation

 Several students attended a 4-day intensive small group Reading and Math Skills Boot Camp. Students spent 3 hours of academic study, 1.25 hours of enrichment activities aimed to support grade-appropriate reading & math concepts.

Summer Learning

Boston GT Steam Academy

The SPS METCO Program partnered with The GT STEAM Academy. 16 rising 5th-8th graders participated in 4 academic classes and 4 selected electives during a week long summer learning. Special events included field trips, community meetings/celebrations



Summer Learning

St Stephens B-SAFE Program (The Bishop's Summer Academic & Enrichment Program)

- five-week, full-day academic and enrichment program for 1st-5th graders
- academic classes-reading, writing and math
- elective classes-visual and performing art, science recreational activities and field trips.
- healthy breakfast and lunch served each day, along with an end of day snack.
- programs were based in Episcopal churches and schools with no required religious component.
